## Detailed Itinerary

### Day 01: 01 April 2013

### Arrival into Entebbe

On arrival at Entebbe Airport today on flight **EK729** at **12h45** you will be met after passing through immigrations and transferred to the **Boma Guesthouse** where you will spend **1 night** on a **bed and breakfast basis**.

Welcome to Africa!

#### Boma Guest House

The Boma is set in tropical gardens in a leafy suburb, a few minutes' drive from Entebbe International Airport. As it is an ideal stopover for all airline passengers, airport transfers are offered free of charge. The rooms are specifically designed to reflect the original colonial architecture. They are individually decorated in a mixture of African and European décor, and yet combine modern comforts with the charm and character of the original 1940's home.



### Day 02: 02 April 2013

### Entebbe ~ Lake Mburo National Park

### B/L/D

You will be met this morning at **08h00** by your private guide, and depart for Lake Mburo National Park, about a 5 / 6 hour drive from Kampala.

On entering the national park you will experience a game drive to **Mihingo Lodge** where you will spend **1 night** on a **full board basis**.

#### Mihingo Lodge

Mihingo Lodge is a peaceful and exclusive retreat adjacent to Lake Mburo National Park. 10 luxury spacious tented rooms, all enjoying stunning views, are built on stilted wooden platforms covered by thatched roofs, and with en suite bathrooms. Each room is nestled on a private piece of the lodge's property, enabling guests to enjoy the tranquil environment in complete seclusion. Some rooms are situated in a forest, several with a lake view, and others on a rocky outcrop.





### **Lake Mburo National Park**

Although a very small national park, at only 260 square kms, Lake Mburo has an amazing diversity of habitats including forest galleries, seasonal and permanent swamps and rich acacia wood valleys, all which support a wealth of wildlife. With an extensive area of wetland, Lake Mburo attracts some beautiful waterbirds, and provides a habitat for a wide range of both fauna and flora.



### **Day 03: 03 April 2013      Lake Mburo ~ Bwindi Impenetrable Forest      B/L/D**

This morning you will be taken on a guided walking safari, before leaving Lake Mburo and continuing to the southern section of the Bwindi Impenetrable Forest, where you will spend the next **2 nights** at **Nkuringo Gorilla Camp** on a **full board basis**.

### **Nkuringo Gorilla Camp**

The Nkuringo Gorilla Camp overlooks a beautiful swath of the world renowned Bwindi Impenetrable Forest National Park. The camp has panoramic views of the majestic volcanoes of the Virunga chain and across the escarpment into the Albertine Rift Valley within the DR Congo, and is a prime access point for a trek to see the Nkuringo group of Mountain Gorillas.

Facilities include 2 beautifully hand crafted en-suite cottages and 6 Virunga Terrace rooms. Each cottage has a private terrace with wonderful views. The camp has a small restaurant where visitors will enjoy tasty wholesome meals freshly prepared from locally sourced foodstuffs wherever possible.



### **Day 04: 04 April 2013      Bwindi Impenetrable Forest      B/L/D**

Today will be one of many highlights of your journey as you trek into the forest in search of mountain gorillas. Being led by expert guides, you will have an exciting hike until you find your habituated gorilla family.

You will have one hour to spend with these fascinating and beautiful creatures, before returning to camp to rest for the night.

### **Bwindi Impenetrable Forest**

Located in the south-western corner of Uganda, in the Virunga Mountains along the border with the DRC, Bwindi Impenetrable Forest is a thick, lush, green jungle, housing heaps of wildlife and half of the world's remaining mountain gorilla population.

This pocket of huge primeval forest is one of the most biologically diverse areas on earth. It has an eco-system that defines the very essence of the continent and has therefore been designated as a World Heritage Site.



### **Day 05: 05 April 2013      Bwindi Impenetrable Forest ~ Kigali      B/L**

After an early breakfast this morning you will depart for the Rwandan border, where you will cross into "the land of a thousand hills" and continue through to Kigali. In the capital city you will be taken to the Genocide Memorial, before heading to the **Kigali Serena Hotel** to spend **1 night** on a **bed and breakfast basis**.



### **Kigali Serena Hotel**

Ideally located in central Kigali on one of its most charming boulevards, the 5 star Kigali Serena Hotel is built around a polished granite atrium, which showcases Rwandese art.

Relaxed yet elegant, the hotel centres on the Executive Lounge and bar, which opens onto a wide sundeck overlooking the swimming pool and gardens. Also near the pool is the Milima Restaurant offering you a variety of all-day buffet choices, while the Sokoni Café offers indoor and outdoor poolside seating.



**Day 06: 06 April 2013**

**Kigali ~ Serengeti National Park**

**B/L/D**

You will need to be up bright and early this morning to head for the Kigali Airport in time for your **Coastal Aviation** flight departing at **06h00** for Mwanza (Tanzania) where you will pass through immigration before taking off again and landing at the Seronera Airstrip in the Serengeti.

Upon landing you will be met by your private Tanzanian guide, and head off on a game drive to the **Serengeti Serena Lodge** where you will spend **2 nights** on a **full board basis**.

### **Serengeti Serena Lodge**

Located adjacent to the famous Serengeti National Park Western Corridor and Grumeti River, set high on the saddle of a tree-clad ridge, commanding panoramic views, the lodge has been designed to blend into the landscape.

Accommodation is in a series of two storey domed thatched 'rondavels,' each stone built, and consisting of a private balcony and entrance, spacious bedroom, natural stone bathroom and intricately carved furniture.



**Day 07: 07 April 2013**

**Serengeti National Park**

**B/L/D**

You will have the full day to spend on a game drive today, covering the central area of the Serengeti, or going further afield.

### **Serengeti National Park**

The word "Siringit" means "endless plains", and this is understandably from where the Serengeti National Park takes its name. The iconic, endless, golden plains of Africa are nowhere more evident than within this national park, as they stretch off into eternity, dotted throughout with thousands of animals. Located in the north-west corner of Tanzania, alongside Lake Victoria, the Serengeti has earned its place as one of the world's most famous wildlife areas. While best known for the enormous herds of the wildebeest migration, there is far more to the Serengeti than this, and the national park can be enjoyed even when you are not in the vicinity of this spectacle.



**Day 08: 08 April 2013**

**Serengeti National Park**

**B/L/D**

This morning you will check out of the Serena Lodge and continue deeper into the Serengeti, to **Mbuzi Mawe Tented Camp** where you will spend the next **2 nights** on a **full board basis**.



### **Mbuzi Mawe Tented Camp**

This camp of 16 luxury tents is located in a rocky glade known as 'the place of the klipspringer' (mbuzi mawe).

Each tent has its own en suite bathroom with flushed toilets and showers. The central mess tent houses the scenic safari bar and stone terrace with a central fire-pit for evening sundowners. The camp also has a gift shop and business centre with WiFi.



**Day 09: 09 April 2013**

**Serengeti National Park**

**B/L/D**

You will have another full day today on game drives in the Serengeti.

**Day 10: 10 April 2013**

**Serengeti National Park ~ Ngorongoro Crater**

**B/L/D**

This morning you will drive back south, through the southern section of the Serengeti, and onwards to the Ngorongoro Crater, where you will spend **1 night** at the **Ngorongoro Sopa Lodge** on a **full board basis**,

### **Ngorongoro Sopa Lodge**

Situated on the eastern rim of the Ngorongoro Crater, the 90 double bedrooms of Ngorongoro Sopa Lodge each accommodate two queen sized beds and a separate dressing area.

Each room has a glass fronted veranda, where a private view of the Crater may be enjoyed. The lodge also has 6 single rooms with queen sized beds and glass sliding doors.



**Day 11: 11 April 2013**

**Ngorongoro Crater**

**B/L/D**

Yet another highlight awaits you this morning as you drive through the mist to the floor of the Crater, to spend the day on a game drive covering the Crater floor. Following a picnic lunch you will leave the Crater in the afternoon and drive to the town of Karatu, below the outer slopes, to spend the next **2 nights** at the **Ngorongoro Farmhouse** on a **full board basis**.

### **Ngorongoro Farmhouse**

Ngorongoro Farm House is a small, exclusive lodge facing the Oldeani Volcano. It nestles in a 500 acre coffee farm located about 5 km from the Lolduare entrance to the Ngorongoro Conservation Area and was built to offer guests an atmosphere of the old days.

50 spacious cottages are designed on the style of an old colonial farm and rustically decorated with local materials. Standard features in each cottage are large beds with mosquito nets, telephones, en suite bathrooms with built in showers, and private verandas.



### **Ngorongoro Crater**

A unique and fascinating game viewing destination in Africa, the Ngorongoro Crater is a must-see on any Tanzania safari.

Being the world's largest intact caldera, and the result of a collapsed volcano thousands of years ago, the 260 square kilometres of crater floor hosts up to 25 000 animals at all times of year. This makes it one of the most dense wildlife areas in Africa, and allows for many memorable sightings.





**Day 12: 12 April 2013**

**Ngorongoro Crater/Lake Manyara**

**B/L/D**

Today is scheduled as a free day for you to arrange activities around Karatu, hikes in the surrounding area, or just relax. Alternatively you could return to the Ngorongoro Crater for another game drive, or choose to visit Lake Manyara National Park.

Park fees for Ngorongoro Crater are US\$50 per person, and there is a US\$200 vehicle descent fee, which would need to be paid for at the gate.

Park fees for Lake Manyara National Park are US\$35 per person.

**Lake Manyara National Park**

Being a relatively small park, and with Lake Manyara taking up the majority of the area, Lake Manyara National Park can be covered easily on half-day game drives, but these drives are usually very rewarding despite their brevity.

The scenery and birdlife are Lake Manyara's major attractions, with the lake being perfectly located to offer spectacular views along the Great Rift Valley.



**Day 13: 13 April 2013**

**Ngorongoro Crater ~ Stone Town**

**B/L**

From Karatu you will drive to Arusha today, where you bid your guide farewell and catch a Coastal Aviation flight from Arusha Airport to Zanzibar, departing at **12h15** and landing at **14h00**. You will be met on arrival and transferred into Stone Town, to the **Zanzibar Serena Inn** to spend **1 night** on a **bed and breakfast basis**.

You will have the evening free to explore this ancient town and try out some of the local restaurants and markets.

**Zanzibar Serena Inn**

Idyllically situated on the sea-front of ancient Stone Town, and flanked by an exotic mix of sultan's palaces, Portuguese forts, ancient dhow harbours, and bright bazaars, the Zanzibar Serena Inn is a haven of tranquillity and opulence amongst the bustle of one of Africa's most ancient and most enchanting towns.



**Stone Town**

The capital of Zanzibar is Zanzibar Town, in which Stone Town is a bustling, energetic and fascinating ancient part. With narrow mazes as streets, and intricately carved doors decorating the white-washed buildings, Stone Town invites you to explore its inner zones, and many an hour can be spent taking it all in. The sights and sounds, and the spicy smells, somehow remind you of a time long ago, and on exiting the web of alleys you feel as if you have left behind another world in another age.



**Day 14: 14 April 2013**

**Stone Town ~ Zanzibar Coast**

**B/D**

You will have some more time in Stone Town this morning before being collected from the hotel at **11h30** and transferred across the island to the northern coast, where you will spend the next **4 nights** at **Essque Zalu Zanzibar** in a garden suite on a **half board basis**.



### Essque Zalu Zanzibar

Essque Zalu is nestled in a natural cove on the north east coast of Zanzibar, overlooking the Indian Ocean.

The 40 luxurious-styled suites all enjoy picturesque views over the lush tropical garden or the turquoise blue of the ocean. They are crafted from local materials, adorned with native artwork and housed under a traditional pitched Makuti roof.



**Days 15 - 17: 15 - 17 April 2013**

**Zanzibar Coast**

**B/D**

You will have 3 full days to enjoy the Zanzibar beaches, taking part in some of the many activities available on the island, or just relaxing on the deck bar, with a cold cocktail.

Activities can be arranged through the resort.



### Zanzibar

The Zanzibar Archipelago has lured travellers to its pristine, white beaches for centuries, and continues to be the drawcard for sun-seeking, beach-loving tourists from all over the world.

The main island of Zanzibar (correctly named Unguja), has a plethora of accommodation options, ranging from rustic beach bungalows to large and glitzy resorts, and can offer something to everyone's taste. Sandy beaches run the length of the coast, shaded by green palm trees, and caressed by turquoise waters.

**Day 18: 18 April 2013**

**Zanzibar ~ Dar es Salaam**

**B**

You will be collected from your resort at **13h15** today, and transferred to the Zanzibar Port in time for the **15h30** ferry to Dar es Salaam, where you will arrive at **17h30**.

You will be met outside the ferry terminal in Dar es Salaam (there will be a throng of drivers, so look out for your names) and transferred to the **Southern Sun Dar es Salaam** to spend **1 night** on a **bed and breakfast basis**.

### Southern Sun Dar es Salaam

Southern Sun Dar es Salaam is located in the heart of Tanzania's business capital. The hotel is in the commercial centre of the city, and it borders the Botanical Gardens and diplomatic offices. The central location of the hotel makes it a perfect choice for international business travellers, NGO's staff, and diplomats.



**Day 19: 19 April 2013**

**Dar es Salaam ~ Okavango Delta**

**B/D**

It will be another early start this morning as you are transferred from your hotel to Dar es Salaam Airport in time for your flight **SA189** to Johannesburg departing at **06h50** and landing at **09h25**. In Johannesburg you will connect with flight **SA8300** departing at **11h25** and arriving in Maun at **13h00**.

You will be met on arrival in Maun and assisted onto your light aircraft flight into the Okavango Delta, where you will spend the next **4 nights** at **Moremi Crossing** on a **fully inclusive basis**.



**Moremi Crossing**

Moremi Crossing consists of 16 en suite and spacious tents on raised decks, each with their own veranda. The camp is built on a palm fringed island surrounded by the Moremi's game-rich seasonal floodplains and overlooking Chief's Island. Moremi Crossing is a new style safari camp combining luxury with simplicity. This is a 100% eco-friendly development featuring the latest in solar and waste disposal technology.



**Day 20 - 22: 20 - 22 April 2013**

**Okavango Delta**

**B/L/D**

You will have these 3 full days to enjoy a true delta experience. Without any vehicles, your days will be spent on walking safaris and boat and mokoro (dug-out canoes) on the channels of the Delta.



**Okavango Delta**

The very word "Okavango" evokes a sense of adventure and exploration, and this is exactly what the Okavango Delta is about. Often called the Okavango Swamps, this intricate maze of waterways and sandy islands is an explorer's dream, and the destination should be on the wishlist of anyone looking for a unique travel experience.

The geology of the Delta is fascinating, with its creation being attributed to tectonic plate action from thousands of years ago causing the Kavango River to flow from Angola into the Kalahari Desert as opposed to the Atlantic Ocean.

**Day 23: 23 April 2013**

**Okavango Delta ~ Chobe National Park**

**B/L/D**

With another light aircraft flight you will fly out of the Delta today to Kasane, where you will be met on arrival and transferred to **Chobe Safari Lodge** to spend the next **2 nights** on a **full board basis**.

Included during your stay here are 3 game viewing activities, made up of boat cruises and / or game drives. This afternoon will be spent on your first activity.

**Chobe Safari Lodge**

Chobe Safari Lodge is situated in Kasane on the banks of the Chobe River and shares a border with Chobe National Park. Right on the doorstep is the meeting of four African countries: Botswana, Namibia, Zimbabwe and Zambia.

Chobe Safari Lodge therefore offers an excellent getaway location to Chobe, Victoria Falls or Caprivi. The lodge's close proximity to Victoria Falls, Livingstone and Kasane International Airports make it easily accessible with daily road transfers or charter flights connecting all these airports with Chobe Safari Lodge.



**Day 24: 24 April 2013**

**Chobe National Park**

**B/L/D**

Today will be spent on your remaining activities, while extra excursions can be arranged through the lodge.





### **Chobe National Park**

Accessed easily via a 1.5 hour flight from Johannesburg, or a 1 hour drive from Victoria Falls, Chobe National Park is the most visited park on a Boswana safari itinerary.

With an enormous elephant population, as well as magnificent birdlife and a huge array of herbivores and aquatic animals, it is often hard to believe that Chobe National Park is for real.

The game viewing starts from the moment you land at Kasane Airport, or drive across the border from Zambia or Zimbabwe, with warthogs foraging in the streets, buffalo being habitual visitors to the town, and hippos lazing around in the river.

### **Day 25: 25 April 2013      Chobe ~ Livingstone / Victoria Falls      B/L/D**

This morning you will be collected at **09h00** transferred from Chobe Safari Lodge across the border into Zambia, where you will be taken to Tongabezi, and from there by boat to **Sindabezi Island** to spend the next **2 nights** on a **fully inclusive basis**.

### **Sindabezi Island**

Sindabezi Island is an idyllic, exclusive camp on a very private isle on the Zambezi River. Sindabezi has only 5 open-sided thatched cottages, allowing you to soak up the sights and sounds of the African bush in a pristine setting. Views across the flood plains of the Zambezi and into the nearby national park complete the experience.



### **Day 26: 26 April 2013      Livingstone / Victoria Falls      B/L/D**

Included during your stay here are canoeing excursions, boat cruises, game drives (park fees are extra), visit to Victoria Falls (entrance fee to the Falls is extra), fishing, village visit and guided bush walks.

### **Victoria Falls**

"Mosi Oa Tunya", or "The Smoke That Thunders", Victoria Falls are as magnificent on the 10th visit as they are on the 1st, and their thundering roar makes everything else seem strangely quiet once you leave them behind.

As the mighty Zambezi flows over a chasm of 1 mile wide, and 110 metres high, to violently crash on the rocks below, the resultant spray is sent tens of metres up into the air, before it lands back down in a continuous rainfall. The water then rushes through an opening of only 50 metres, as the Zambezi races further along, over churning rapids and through the deep Batoka Gorge.



### **Day 27: 27 April 2013      Livingstone ~ Lower Zambezi National Park      B/D**

This morning you will be transferred to Livingstone Airport in time for your Proflight flight departing at **09h40** and landing in Lusaka at **10h50**. In Lusaka you will connect onto you Ngwazi flight departing at **11h30** and landing at the Royal Airstrip in the Lower Zambezi National Park at **12h00**.

Upon landing you will be met by a camp guide an driven to **Kasaka River Lodge** to spend the next **4 nights** on a **fully inclusive basis**.

### **Kasaka River Lodge**

Nestled on the banks of the Zambezi River in the Chiawa Game Management area, Kasaka River Lodge is set in a natural bush environment and is 4 kms by road from the Lower Zambezi National Park. Kasaka River Lodge is a 20 bed luxury tented camp with each chalet secluded amongst the native flora. The river extends the length of the property and there are breathtaking views over the water with sightings of buffalo, elephant, hippo and crocodile.



**Day 28 - 30: 28 - 30 April 2013**

**Lower Zambezi National Park**

**B/L/D**

These 3 full days will be spent enjoying the numerous activities available from the lodge. Included during your stay are walking safaris, boat cruises, fishing and canoeing excursions, and day and night game drives.

### **Lower Zambezi National Park**

As the name explains, Lower Zambezi National Park is set along the banks of the mighty Zambezi River, which forms the border between Zambia and Zimbabwe. On the other side of the river is Mana Pools National Park, which helps to create a large conservation zone in the Zambezi River valley. Largely undeveloped, Lower Zambezi provides travellers with an action filled Zambian safari, with walking safaris, canoeing, boat cruises and fishing excursions all being available.



**Day 31: 01 May 2013**

**Day of Departure**

**B/L**

You will have most of the day to enjoy being in the bush some more before being taken to the airstrip in time for your Ngwazi flight departing at **16h30** and landing in Lusaka at **17h00**. In Lusaka you will check in for your international flight **EK714** departing at **21h25**.
