Detailed Itinerary

Day 01: 28 July 2012 Johannesburg

This morning you will make your own way to Sydney International Airport in time for your flight to Johannesburg (flights not included in quotation and booked directly by travellers).

On arrival in Johannesburg you will be met at the airport and transferred into Rosebank to spend **2 nights** at the **Rosebank Holiday Inn** on a **bed and breakfast** basis.

Rosebank Holiday Inn

You can't miss the contemporary, grey-striped facade of Holiday Inn Johannesburg-Rosebank, next to the futuristic Zone shopping centre.

Relax on the sunny pool deck when you arrive from O.R. Tambo International Airport, 25km away. It's easy to get to meetings in the surrounding Rosebank business suburb and in downtown Johannesburg, which is a 15-minute taxi ride.



Day 02: 29 July 2012 Johannesburg

Today at **11h00** you will be collected from your hotel and taken on a 5 hour guided tour of Soweto and Johannesburg.

This evening you will head out to a local African restaurant for dinner.



Johannesburg

Although usually only used for quick stopovers by most travellers, Josburg is an exciting and vibrant city, with some excellent hotels, fantastic shopping facilities, loads of historic significance, and a flourishing sporting culture.

With the launch of the Gautrain in 2010, the Sandton district is now only 10 minutes from the airport, and this puts one in position to easily access most of the cities highlights.

<u>Day 03: 30 July 2012</u> <u>Johannesburg – Okavango Delta</u> B/L/D

This morning at **07h15** you will be met at your hotel and transferred back to Johannesburg International Airport in time for your flight **BP212** departing at **10h10** and arriving in Maun at **11h50** (flight booked by African Ubuntu Safaris).

On arrival you will be met and assisted onto your light aircraft flight into the Okavango Delta where you will spend the next **3 nights** at **Pom Pom Camp** on a **fully inclusive** basis.

Pom Pom Camp

The Camp is located on Pom Island in a private concession situated in the heart of the Okavango Delta and on the head waters of the Xudum river system.

The area lies on the western boundary of the Moremi Game Reserve and offers superb Okavango scenery and a true Okavango wilderness experience.



<u>Day 04 & 05: 31 July 2012 & 01 August 2012</u> Okavango Delta B/L/D

You will have 2 full days to enjoy the numerous activities offered by Pom Pom Camp. These include day and night game drives, walking safaris, mokoro and boat excursions and fishing.





Okavango Delta

The very word "Okavango" evokes a sense of adventure and exploration, and this is exactly what the Okavango Delta is about. Often called the Okavango Swamps, this intricate maze of waterways and sandy islands is an explorer's dream, and the destination should be on the wishlist of anyone looking for a unique travel experience.

The geology of the Delta is fascinating, with its creation being attributed to techtonic plate action from thousands of years ago causing the Kavango River to flow from Angola into the Kalahari Desert as opposed to the Atlantic Ocean.

Day 06: 02 August 2012

<u>Okavango – Chobe National Park</u>

B/L/D

This morning you will catch another light aircraft flight out of the Okavango to Kasane, where you will be met and transferred to **Chobe Safari Lodge** where you will spend the next **2 nights** on a **full board** basis.

During your stay here 3 game viewing activities are included, comprising game drives in Chobe National Park and boat cruises on the Chobe River.

This afternoon you will take part in your first activity.

Chobe Safari Lodge

Chobe Safari Lodge is situated in Kasane on the banks of the Chobe River and shares a border with Chobe National Park. Right on the doorstep is the meeting of four African countries: Botswana, Namibia, Zimbabwe and Zambia.

Chobe Safari Lodge therefore offers an excellent getaway location to Chobe, Victoria Falls or Caprivi. The lodge's close proximity to Victoria Falls, Livingstone and Kasane International Airports make it easily accessible with daily road transfers or charter flights connecting all these airports with Chobe Safari Lodge.



Day 07: 03 August 2012

Chobe National Park

B/L/D

Today will be spent on your remaining game viewing activities. Extra activities can be arranged and booked directly through Chobe Safari Lodge, including boat excursions, game drives, village visits and fishing excursions.



Chobe National Park

Accessed easily via a 1.5 hour flight from Johannesburg, or a 1 hour drive from Victoria Falls, Chobe National Park is the most visited park on a Boswana safari itinerary.

With an enormous elephant population, as well as magnificent birdlife and a huge array of herbivores and aquatic animals, it is often hard to believe that Chobe National Park is for real.

The game viewing starts from the moment you land at Kasane Airport, or drive across the border from Zambia or Zimbabwe, with warthogs foraging in the streets, buffalo being habitual visitors to the town, and hippos lazing around in the river.



Day 08: 04 August 2012

Chobe – Victoria Falls

This morning at **10h00** you will be met at your lodge and transferred across the border from Botswana into Zimbabwe. You will be taken to the **Victoria Falls Hotel** where you will spend **1 night** on a **bed and breakfast** basis. After checking into the hotel you will be taken on a guided tour of the Falls before heading to the airstrip at **14h00** in time for your 15 minute helicopter "flight of angels" over Victoria Falls. This at **19h00** you will top off the exciting day with a fun-filled African dinner at the Boma Restaurant, complete with African drumming and dancing.



Victoria Falls Hotel

The Victoria Falls Hotel, popularly known as "the grand old lady of the Falls", is situated in the Victoria Falls National Park, a world heritage site, and is a member of the exclusive Leading Hotels of the World group.

The Edwardian-style five-star hotel, built in 1904, was recently redecorated and refurbished and now combines the charm of the old with the convenience of the new. Set in lush tropical gardens with lily ponds, palm trees and semi-tropical shrubs, it provides the tranquillity and seclusion that many guests seek.

Victoria Falls

"Mosi Oa Tunya", or "The Smoke That Thunders", Victoria Falls are as magnificent on the 10th visit as they are on the 1st, and their thundering roar makes everything else seem strangely quiet once you leave them behind.

As the mighty Zambezi flows over a chasm of 1 mile wide, and 110 metres high, to violently crash on the rocks below, the resultant spray is sent tens of metres up into the air, before it lands back down in a continuous rainfall. The water then rushes through an opening of only 50 metres, as the Zambezi races further along, over churning rapids and through the deep Batoka Gorge.



Day 09: 05 August 2012

Victoria Falls – Cape Town

This morning at **o6h3o** you will be collected and taken for your exciting walk with lions.

You will then be collected from your hotel at **11h30** and transferred to Victoria Falls Airport in time for your flight **BA6282** departing at **13h55** and arriving in Johannesburg at **15h35**. In Johannesburg you will pass through immigrations and connect onto flight **BA6431** departing at **18h00** and arriving in Cape Town at **20h10** (flights booked by African Ubuntu Safaris).

In Cape Town you will be met at the airport and transferred to Camps Bay where you will spend the next **4 nights** at **100 Geneva Drive** on a **self-catering** basis.

100 Geneva Drive

100 Geneva villa is an exquisite luxury holiday rental in Camps Bay, with recent renovations taking much care to ensure that each bedroom benefits from access to the garden, balconies and the Camps Bay sea views.

This self catering luxury holiday villa is built over two levels; the upper level consists of a large open plan lounge, dining room and self catering kitchen area which all opens up on to a large outdoor terrace. <u>Day 13: 09 August 2012</u> <u>Cape Town – Arusha</u>

This morning will be an early start as you are collected at **04h15** and transferred to Cape Town Airport for your flight **SA302** departing at **06h00** and arriving in Johannesburg at **08h00**.

In Johannesburg you will connect onto flight **SA186** departing at **09h30** and arriving in Dar es Salaam (Tanzania) at **13h55**. In Dar es Salaam you will pass through immigrations and connect onto flight **PW436** departing at **16h00** and arriving at Kilimanjaro International at **17h20**.

(Above flights booked by African Ubuntu Safaris.)

On arrival you will be met and transferred to the **Serena Mountain Village** where you will spend **1 night** on a **bed and breakfast** basis.

Serena Mountain Village

Nestled at the foot of the wooded slopes of Mount Meru, the Serena Mountain Village stands amid coffee plantations on the shores of tranquil Lake Duluti. Designed to echo the traditional style of the colonial coffee farm, which originally stood on this site, Mountain Village offers a range of cottage-styled rooms set amid extensive landscaped grounds.



Day 14: 10 August 2012

<u> Arusha – Tarangire National Park</u>

Your Tanzanian wildlife safari starts today as you are met at your lodge by your private driver-guides and depart in 4x4 vehicles to Tarangire National Park, where you will spend the next **2 nights** at **Oliver's Camp** on a **fully inclusive basis**.

This afternoon will be spent on a game drive.

Oliver's Camp

Located in the middle of the Tarangire wilderness, Oliver's Camp provides 10 guest tents scattered along the marsh edge with excellent views over the permanent water source. Each newly refurbished tent is now covered by traditional thatch and offers an outdoor shower with indoor toilet and wash facilities. Every evening guests relax or read in the lounge and library tent, or drink sundowners at the fireplace after an exciting day in the heart of Tarangire.





Day 15: 11 August 2012

Tarangire National Park

Today will be spent on game drives inside Tarangire National Park.



Tarangire National Park

In the past, Tarangire National Park was often overlooked by visitors to Tanzania, however it is now holding its own as one of the best dry season parks in the region.

During the dry months of July through to October, an enormous amount of wildlife is drawn inside Tarangire to access the water from the Tarangire River and the Silale Swamps, allowing for very rewarding game viewing experiences.

Day 16: 12 August 2012

Tarangire - Ngorongoro Crater

This morning you will leave Oliver's Camp early and drive out of Tarangire National Park and into Lake Manyara National Park where you will spend the morning on a game drive before continuing to the Ngorongoro Crater where you will spend the next **2 nights** on the rim at **Ngorongoro Sopa Lodge** on a **full board** basis.

Ngorongoro Sopa Lodge

Situated on the eastern rim of the Ngorongoro Crater, the 90 double bedrooms of Ngorongoro Sopa Lodge each accommodate two queen sized beds and a separate dressing area.

Each room has a glass fronted veranda, where a private view of the Crater may be enjoyed. The lodge also has 6 single rooms with queen sized beds and glass sliding doors.

Lodge facilities include a glass domed reception lobby on two levels with a coffee bar area, a circular high volume dining area, a bar with 4 fireplaces, an internet café, and a gift shop. All the major areas allow views of the Crater through floor to ceiling windows.



Day 17: 13 August 2012

Ngorongoro Crater

B/L/D

You will wake up to a beautiful misty morning today as you are taken down the slopes of the Ngorongoro Crater and onto the floor below.

The day will be spent on a game drive covering all of the different eco-systems of this remarkable location, enjoying a picnic lunch before returning up to the Crater rim to enjoy sundowners and a good night sleep.



Ngorongoro Crater

A unique and fascinating game viewing destination in Africa, the Ngorongoro Crater is a must-see on any Tanzania safari.

Being the world's largest intact caldera, and the result of a collapsed volcano thousands of years ago, the 260 square kilometres of crater floor hosts up to 25 000 animals at all times of year. This makes it one of the most dense wildlife areas in Africa, and allows for many memorable sightings.

Day 18: 14 August 2012

Ngorongoro – Serengeti National Park B/L/D

From the Ngorongoro Crater you will be driven back down to the Manyara Airstrip where you will bid farewell to your guides as you catch your light aircraft flight at **o8h45** into the northern Serengeti, to Kogatende Airstrip where you will land at **o9h45**.



SAFARIS

On arrival you will be met by a camp guides who will take you on a game drive to **Ubuntu Camp** where you will spend the next 3 nights on a fully inclusive basis.

Ubuntu Camp

Ubuntu Camp is a mobile luxury tented camp which follows the natural flow of the wildebeest through the Serengeti eco-system.

Between December and March the camp will be situated on the open southern plains when the annual migration starts their journey north. From June to November the camp is perfectly positioned in a new campsite to intercept the same animals as they arrive in the north.

The Ubuntu guides explore each area in depth based on their expert knowledge of the herds, the animal movements and guests' requirements.



Day 19 & 20: 15 & 16 August 2012

Serengeti National Park

B/L/D

You will have 2 full days spent in the northern Serengeti on game drives offered by Ubuntu Camp in their open-sided safari vehicles.

Being in the northern Serengeti you should be in the ideal location to access the herds of the wildebeest migration as they make their way across the Mara River into Kenya.



Serengeti National Park

The word "Siringit" means "endless plains", and this is understandably from where the Serengeti National Park takes its name. The iconic, endless, golden plains of Africa are nowhere more evident than within this national park, as they stretch off into eternity, dotted throughout with thousands of animals.

Day 21: 17 August 2012



You will have the evening free to explore the town and try out some of the local cuisine.
