Detailed Itinerary

Day 01: 15 Oct 2013

Arrival into Nairobi

On arrival at Jomo Kenyatta International in Nairobi today you will be met and transferred to the **Boma Hotel** where you will spend **1 night** on a **bed and breakfast basis**.



The Boma Hotel

The Boma Nairobi consists of 148 luxury deluxe guest rooms, in different room categories; 120 Superior Rooms, 20 Deluxe Rooms, 6 Business Suites, 1 Executive Suite and 1 Presidential Suite. An Executive Lounge is available for guests staying in Deluxe Rooms and Suites.

All rooms and suites come with luxury amenities including complimentary high-speed internet access, multimedia plug and play port, LED television, Direct Dial Up Telephone. All rooms have access to 24 hour rooms service.

Day 02: 16 Oct 2013

Nairobi – Amboseli National Park

This morning you will be collected early from your hotel and transferred to Wilson Airport in time for your flight to Amboseli. On arrival you will be met and driven to **Tortilis Camp** where you will spend **2 nights** on a **fully inclusive basis**.



Tortilis Camp

Tortilis Camp is named after the flat-topped, umbrella thorn tree, the Acacia Tortilis, and is situated in one of Amboseli's areas of Acacia Tortilis woodland, with the majestic backdrop of Africa's highest mountain, and the world's highest free-standing mountain, snow-capped Kilimanjaro.

The spacious 16 makuti-covered tents each consist of a main bedroom (with wooden floors), permanent en-suite bathroom (hot running water, stone floors, shower and flush toilet) and spacious veranda. A main lounge, bar and dining area, all built with natural materials and thatched roofs, offer magnificent views of Kilimanjaro.

Day 03: 17 Oct 2013

Amboseli National Park

B/L/D

Activities included at Tortilis Camp are game drives and walking safaris, and you will have a full day to enjoy exploring Amboseli National Park on these.

Amboseli National Park

The combination of masses of animals, diverse eco-systems, and the splendid views of Mount Kilimanjaro make Amboseli National Park high up on the must-see list of any Kenyan safari.

With desert landscapes to lush green swampland, the scenery changes entirely during game drives, with new photo opportunities presenting themselves all the time.

Amboseli is famous for its huge elephant herds, and is home to a remarkable concentration of species and birdlife, all the while being watched over by the highest peak in Africa.





Day 04: 18 Oct 2013

Amboseli – Masai Mara

This morning you will be driven back to the airstrip in time for your flight to the Masai Mara, via Nairobi. On arrival at the airstrip in the Mara you will be met by a guide and driven to **Porini Lion Camp** where you will spend the next **4 nights** on a **fully inclusive** basis.

Porini Lion Camp

Porini Lion Camp is located in the 20,000 acre Olare Orok Conservancy which borders the Masai Mara Game Reserve and is home to an abundance of animals including the big cats for which the Mara is famous. It is the ideal base from which to experience the million strong wildebeest migration. This eco-friendly camp has no permanent structure and is situated along the Ntiakatiak River, a seasonal river with hippo pools nearby. There are 10 spacious tents all having an en suite bathroom with flush toilet and hot shower. A private veranda runs along the length of each tent, providing a secluded and private 'space' for you to relax and enjoy the beauty of this African wilderness.



Day 06 - 08: 19 - 21 Oct 2013

Masai Mara Game Reserve

Being in a private concession, Porini Lion Camp offers numerous activities, including full day game drives, night drives, walking safaris and guided village visits. Having 3 full days here will ensure you experience a large amount of wildlife sightings, as well as some more active experiences and some of Kenya's culture.

Masai Mara Game Reserve

It is no surprise that the Masai Mara ranks up near the top of most famous game reserves in the world. The land of the Mara is consistently covered with herds of antelope, interspersed with prides of lions, journeys of giraffe, dazzles of zebra, and almost every other collective animal noun you can think of. The sightings are nothing short of fantastic, and it is definitely the park to visit to tick off your "wildlife of Africa" list. The scenery of the park is similar to the plains of the Serengeti, although the Mara is dotted with more trees, and the game viewing is equal to, or can be better than, its southerly sister.



Day 09: 22 Oct 2013

Booking terms and conditions:

- In order to confirm a booking, a 30% non-refundable deposit is required
- Balance payment is due 60 days prior to start date
- For flights and gorilla trekking permits, 100% payment is due immediately

Cancellation terms and conditions:

- All cancellations must be advised of in writing
- Cancellation penalties:
 - For cancellations made more than 60 days prior to start date: 30% cancellation penalty will apply (i.e. full deposit)
 - For cancellations made between 45 and 60 days prior to departure date: 50% cancellation penalty will apply
 - For cancellation made less than 45 days prior to departure date: 100% cancellation penalty will apply (i.e. the full booking cost)

Insurance:

- African Ubuntu Safaris strongly insists that every traveller purchases comprehensive travel insurance. As the deposit is non-refundable, and cancellation penalties apply, insurance must be taken out which can cover you in the event of you needing to cancel your travel plans. African Ubuntu Safaris will not be liable for any costs resulting from any traveller's failure to purchase travel insurance.

Passenger and Travel Information

- Travellers should bring only soft sided bags on safaris.
- All travellers must have Identification Card / Passport with them for internal flights.
- Luggage restrictions are in place when travelling in Africa, especially concerning light aircraft flights. In general, in Southern Africa the weight limit is 20 kgs per person, and in East Africa the limit is 15 kgs per person. This includes hand luggage. It is possible to pay for extra weight allowance.
- A yellow fever vaccination is compulsory for a number of African countries. Please consult a travel doctor for up to date information.
- Travellers must have a passport which is valid for more than 6 months after the end date of the itinerary.
- Travellers' passports must have a minimum 2 blank pages per country to be visited

Additional remarks:

- We may have to reroute the itinerary or accommodate in similar lodges in case of non-availability at the time of booking.
- Prices for domestic flights, airport taxes or park fees may be changed without prior notice. This is beyond our control and any increase levied will be passed to you.
