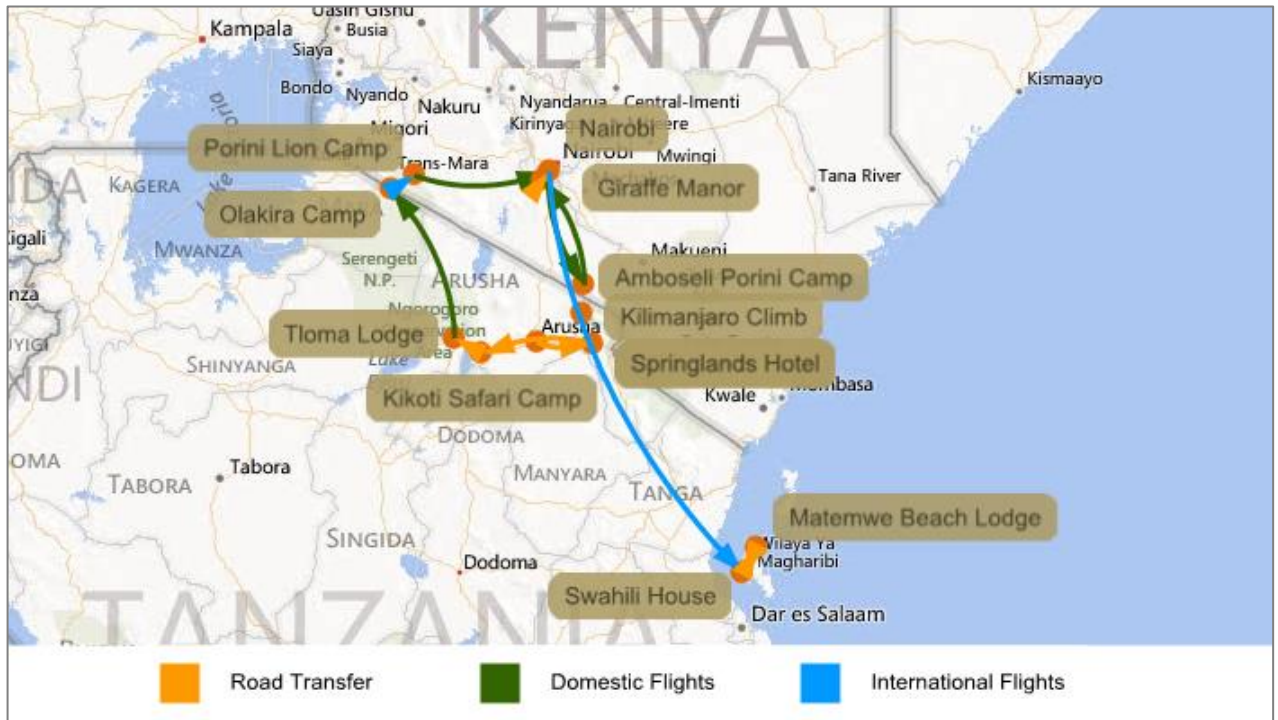

DETAILED DAILY ITINERARY

Day 1	11 Jul 2014	Arrive in Moshi
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Zoe: Upon arrival at the Kilimanjaro International Airport off your international flight **PW436 (booked by you)** at **17h55**, you will be met and transferred to the **Springlands Hotel** in Moshi, where you will spend **2 nights** on a **bed and breakfast basis**.



Arrive: 11 Jul 2014 | Depart: 13 Jul 2014

2 nights (breakfast)



Springlands Hotel

Springlands Hotel near Moshi in Tanzania is an ideal base for mountain walking trips and safaris to Kilimanjaro, Mount Meru and other wilderness areas in Northern Tanzania. The hotel is located on the Southern slopes of Kilimanjaro. The hotel offers excellent value at competitive prices. It has a large swimming pool, an airy dining area set in pleasant gardens, and indoor and outdoor bars. The rooms all have spacious tiled en-suite facilities with showers, windows fitted with mosquito netting and fans.

Day 2

12 Jul 2014

Moshi

You will have the day to prepare for your climb before you are met in the late afternoon for an equipment check and climb briefing.

Day 3

13 Jul 2014

Tanzania ~ Kilimanjaro National Park

After completing the necessary registration formalities at Londorossi National Park Gate (2,360 m.), it is an easy day of walking from the Lemosho road, heading up a small path through beautiful and lush forest. You have lunch in the glades before continuing to the **Mti Mkubwa Campsite** (2,895 m.) where you will camp **1 night on a full board basis**. This area is home to a variety of game including buffalo.

3-4 hours walking / 6 Kms

Arrive: 13 Jul 2014 | Depart: 19 Jul 2014

6 nights (all meals)



Camping (Lemosho Route Kilimanjaro Climb)

The Lemosho Route approaches Mount Kilimanjaro through forest and moorland from the west, crossing the caldera of Shira volcano and exploring the rock formations of the plateau, before traversing beneath the Southern icefields of Kibo. The final ascent is made by the Barafu route. Lemosho is a little-used approach route and there is time to enjoy the unspoilt wilderness of Shira Plateau before the convergence with other routes in the later stages of the trip.

Kilimanjaro National Park

The highest peak in Africa, at 5 895 metres, Kilimanjaro's snow capped peak dominates the horizon from many miles away. While usually best seen from across the border in Kenya, climbing Kilimanjaro starts from near the town of Moshi, and requires a minimum of 6 days to attempt. A Kili climb is a huge drawcard for many tourists, and is a great way to start or end your Tanzanian holiday, being easy to combine with either a wildlife safari or a relaxing stay on one of the tropical islands.



**Day 4****14 Jul 2014****Kilimanjaro National Park**

You soon leave the forest (2,895 m.) behind and enter the moorland zone of giant heather. The trail climbs steadily with wide views to reach the rim of the Shira Plateau. There is a tangible sense of wilderness, especially when the afternoon mists come in! You camp in the centre of the plateau at “**Shira One**” (3,505 m) for **1 night** on a **full board basis**.

5-6 hours walking / 8 Kms

Day 5**15 Jul 2014****Kilimanjaro National Park**

This will be an easy day to help acclimatisation, and to explore the volcanic rock formations of Shira Plateau. You walk to the summit of Shira Cathedral, a huge buttress of rock flanked by steep pinnacles, before reaching the next camp near Shira Hut (3,810 m.). This campsite has some of the most stunning views on Kilimanjaro, close to the glaciated dome of Kibo and the jagged rim of Shira Plateau. The views from here of Mt. Meru floating on the clouds are simply unforgettable. You will camp **1 night** at the **Shira Two Campsite** on a **full board basis**.

3-4 hours walking / 6 Kms

Day 6**16 Jul 2014****Kilimanjaro National Park**

A morning of gentle ascent and panoramic views, you leave the moorland plateau behind to walk on lava ridges beneath the glaciers of the Western Breach. After lunch near the Lava Tower (4,630 m.) we descend to the bottom of the Great Barranco valley (3,976 m.), sheltered by towering cliffs and with extensive views of the plains far below. On this day be careful to notice any signs of altitude sickness. You will camp **1 night** at the **Barranco Campsite** on a **full board basis**.

7-9 hours walking / 11 Kms

Day 7**17 Jul 2014****Kilimanjaro National Park**

A steep climb up the Barranco Wall leads to an undulating trail on the south-eastern flank of Kibo, with superb vistas of the Southern Icefields. Lunch is usually taken at Karanga (3,995 m.), the last water point, in a steep valley. After lunch, the terrain changes to scree and you climb steeply to reach the Barafu campsite (4,673 m.) by mid afternoon. The remainder of the day is spent resting in preparation for the final ascent before a very early night. There are often spectacular views to the plains far below from Barafu. You will camp **1 night** at the **Barafu Campsite** on a **full board basis**.

8-10 hours walking / 9 Kms

Day 8**18 Jul 2014****Summit ~ Mount Kilimanjaro**

You will start your ascent by torchlight at about 1 a.m. so that you can be up on the Crater rim by sunrise. The steep climb over loose volcanic scree has some well-graded zig-zags and a slow but steady pace will take you to Stella Point (5,735 m.), in about five or six hours. You will rest there for a short time to enjoy the sunrise over Mawenzi. Those who are still feeling strong can make the two hour round trip from here along the crater rim to Uhuru Peak (5,896 m.), passing close to the spectacular glaciers and ice cliffs that still occupy most of the summit area. The descent to Barafu is surprisingly fast, and after some refreshment, you continue to descend to reach your final campsite (3,068 m.) at the edge of Mweka Forest. You will camp **1 night** at the **Mweka Forest Campsite** on a **full board basis**.

11-13 hours walking / 17 Kms

**Day 9****19 Jul 2014****Kilimanjaro National Park ~ Tanzania**

A sustained descent through lovely forest with lush undergrowth takes you to the National Park gate at Mweka (1,640 m.). When you finish the climb, there will be a vehicle waiting to meet you and transfer you back to Moshi.

3-4 hours walking / 10 Kms.

Colin: upon arrival at the Kilimanjaro International Airport off your international flight **QR1347 (not included into quotation)** at **15h20**, you will be met and transferred to the **Springlands Hotel** in Moshi, where you and Zoe will spend **1 night** on a **bed & breakfast basis**.

Day 10**20 Jul 2014****Tanzania ~ Tarangire National Park**

You will be met by your guide at **09h00** and transferred (with packed lunch) in your private 4x4 vehicle to the Tarangire National Park. Upon arrival in Tarangire you will undertake a game drive in the Park and proceed to the **Kikoti Safari Camp** a short distance outside the Park boundary, and you will spend **2 nights** here on a **full board basis**. This evening you will have in a scheduled night game drive in a camp open sided vehicle.

Arrive: 20 Jul 2014 | Depart: 22 Jul 2014

2 nights (all meals)



Kikoti Safari Camp

Situated in the heart of the Maasai plains, just 6km from Tarangire National Park, Kikoti's rooms are beautiful raised luxury bandas, with spectacular views of the hills, looking down into the national park. In total, there are 8 double rooms and 10 twin rooms, built from natural materials in tune with their environment, with a design that echoes safari tents from years past. Simple and elegant, the rooms are decorated in warm caramel and creams, with stylish en-suite bathrooms

Tarangire National Park

One of the best dry season parks in the region, from July through to October an enormous amount of wildlife is drawn inside Tarangire to access the water from the Tarangire River and the Silale Swamps, allowing for very rewarding game viewing experiences. The park is home to some of the largest elephant herds of East Africa, and the scenery is particularly popular for the wide open, Serengeti-like plains, decorated with enormous and commanding Baobab trees.

**Day 11****21 Jul 2014****Tarangire National Park**

After an early breakfast, you will enjoy a game walk, returning back to the camp mid morning, followed after the lunch break with an afternoon game drive in the Park.

Day 12**22 Jul 2014****Tarangire National Park ~ Ngorongoro Crater**

This morning there is a game drive in the Lake Manyara National Park, with a packed lunch. You then proceed to the nearby quaint agricultural town of Karatu, where you will spend **2 nights** at the **Tloma Lodge** in the Ngorongoro Highlands on a **full board basis**.



Arrive: 22 Jul 2014 | Depart: 24 Jul 2014

2 nights (all meals)



Tloma Lodge

Tloma Lodge is a 34-cottage lodge situated on top of a valley overlooking a coffee plantation, the Eastern wall of the Ngorongoro crater and a beautiful waterfall. The lodge is built similarly to an old colonial farm, offering guests a relaxing, quiet atmosphere surrounded by beautiful gardens. The 34 spacious rooms all have en suite bathrooms and views looking out over the Ngorongoro Highlands. From the lodge, guided walks can be enjoyed through the beautiful surroundings and to the waterfalls, while those looking for some pampering can enjoy massages.

Ngorongoro Crater

A unique and fascinating game viewing destination, the Ngorongoro Crater is a must-see on any Tanzania safari. Being the world's largest intact caldera, and the result of a collapsed volcano thousands of years ago, the 260 square kilometres of crater floor hosts up to 25 000 animals at all times of year. This makes it one of the most dense wildlife areas in Africa, and allows for many memorable sightings.



Day 13

23 Jul 2014

Ngorongoro Crater

A highlight awaits you this morning as you descend with a picnic lunch 2,000 feet into the Ngorongoro Crater. Due to its size and diversity, the crater floor is comprised of several distinct areas, ranging from forest, swamps, lakes and springs, to open grassland and some sandy dunes. It's an awesome wildlife experience. Lunch is served near a small lake filled with hippos. You then continue game viewing before returning to your lodge.

Day 14

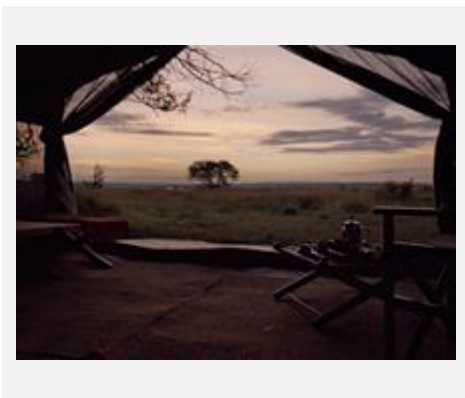
24 Jul 2014

Ngorongoro Crater ~ Serengeti National Park

After an early breakfast you will be transferred to the Manyara Airstrip for your scheduled regional air flight departing at **08h40** to Northern Serengeti's Kogatende Airstrip. Upon arrival at **09h25** you will be met by a camp guide and transferred (with game-viewing en-route) to the **Olakira Mobile Tented Camp** to spend **3 nights** in close proximity to the Mara River **fully inclusive**.

Arrive: 24 Jul 2014 | Depart: 27 Jul 2014

3 nights (all meals and drinks)



Olakira Camp

Meaning "star" in Swahili, Olakira Camp aims to deliver an intimate and authentic safari experience. As the great and dramatic migration makes its way across the expansive Serengeti plains, so the luxury seasonal Olakira Camp follows. Under canvas and intimate, Olakira is made up of 8 spacious and comfortable tents. Each tent features a king size bed, en suite bathroom and private veranda. Time spent at Olakira Camp is channelled into game drives and wildlife viewing.



Serengeti National Park

The word "Siringit" means "endless plains", and this is understandably from where the Serengeti National Park takes its name. The iconic, endless, golden plains of Africa are nowhere more evident than within this national park, as they stretch off into eternity, dotted throughout with thousands of animals. Located in the north-west corner of Tanzania, alongside Lake Victoria, the Serengeti has earned its place as one of the world's most famous wildlife areas.



Day 15 & 16 **25 & 26 Jul 2014** **Serengeti National Park**

For these two full days you will participate in daily game-drives in an open-side vehicle inside the Serengeti National Park, looking for the best vantage points of the remarkable concentrations of game.

Day 17 **27 Jul 2014** **Serengeti National Park ~ Masai Mara Game Reserve**

After breakfast you will be transferred back to the Kogatende Airstrip for your flight to the Masai Mara via Tarime & Migori, departing around **10h05**. Upon arrival at the Tarime Airstrip at **10h25** you will proceed through immigration formalities and then transfer to Migori Airstrip for your flight departing at **12h15**. Upon arrival at the Mara Ol Kiombo Airstrip around **12h45** you will be met and transferred with game-viewing en-route to the **Porini Lion Camp**, spending **2 nights** there on a **fully inclusive basis**.

Arrive: 27 Jul 2014 | Depart: 29 Jul 2014 **2 nights (all meals and drinks)**



Porini Lion Camp

This eco-friendly camp, in the 20,000 acre Olare Orok Conservancy which borders the Masai Mara Game Reserve, has no permanent structure and is situated along the Ntiakatiak River, a seasonal river with hippo pools nearby. There are 10 spacious tents all having an en suite bathroom with flush toilet and hot shower. A private veranda runs along the length of each tent, providing a secluded and private 'space' for you to relax and enjoy the beauty of this African wilderness. Day and night game drives in custom built open-sided 4x4's are accompanied by qualified safari guides. In the evenings you are served sundowners at a scenic spot while enjoying the beauty of an African sunset.

Masai Mara Game Reserve

It is no surprise that the Masai Mara ranks up near the top of most famous game reserves in the world. The land of the Mara is covered with herds of antelope, interspersed with prides of lions, journeys of giraffe, dazzles of zebra, and almost every other collective animal noun you can think of. The sightings are nothing short of fantastic, and it is definitely the park to visit to tick off your "wildlife of Africa" list. The scenery of the park is similar to the open plains of the Serengeti, although the Mara is dotted with more trees, and the game viewing is equal to, or can be better than, its southerly sister



**Day 18****28 Jul 2014****Masai Mara Game Reserve**

Your balloon safari adventure today begins in the pre-dawn hours when you will be driven to the launch point, taking off with the sunrise and followed by a thrilling hour in the air. Your ballooning experience finishes with a flourish, a champagne breakfast in the bush, cooked on the balloon's burners. After breakfast you will re-join the camp and partake in the activities available, including game drives, bush walks and night game drives.

Day 19**29 Jul 2014****Masai Mara Game Reserve ~ Amboseli National Park**

After a morning game-viewing activity you will be transferred back to the Mara Airstrip for your flight departing to the Wilson Airport around **11h00**. Upon arrival at **12h20** you will have a few hours for lunch before departing to the Amboseli National Park around **14h00**. You will be met at Amboseli and transferred to the **Amboseli Porini Camp** to spend **2 nights fully inclusive**. There will be time this afternoon for a game viewing activity.

Arrive: 29 Jul 2014 | Depart: 31 Jul 2014**2 nights (all meals and drinks)****Amboseli Porini Camp**

Porini Amboseli Safari Camp is an award-winning safari camp set in the Amboseli eco-system within the exclusive Selenkay Conservancy- an important wildlife dispersal area for wildlife moving out of Amboseli National Park. The camp is small with just 9 spacious guest tents and retains all the charm and feel of the traditional luxury camps. Tents have solar powered electric lighting with en suite bathrooms including shower, wash basin and flush toilet. The camp provides an exclusive experience with a maximum of 18 guests at a time and is fully inclusive of meals and drinks.

Amboseli National Park

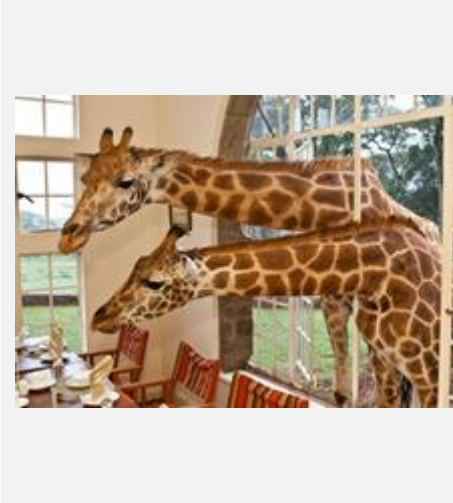
The combination of masses of animals, diverse eco-systems, and the splendid views of Mount Kilimanjaro make Amboseli National Park high up on the must-see list of any Kenyan safari. With desert landscapes to lush green swampland, the scenery changes entirely during game drives, with new photo opportunities presenting themselves all the time. Amboseli is famous for its huge elephant herds, and is home to a remarkable concentration of species and birdlife, all the while being watched over by the highest peak in Africa.

**Day 20****30 Jul 2014****Amboseli National Park**

You will have the day to partake in the camp activities, including game drives, bush walks, and a Masai village visit.

**Day 21****31 Jul 2014****Amboseli National Park ~ Nairobi**

After breakfast you will fly back to Wilson Airport around **09h05**. Upon arrival at **09h50** you will be met and taken to the **Daphne Sheldrick Animal Orphanage** in a secluded area of the Nairobi National Park. After your tour you will be transferred to the **Giraffe Manor** where you will have lunch and spend **2 nights** on a **fully inclusive basis**.

Arrive: 31 Jul 2014 | Depart: 02 Aug 2014**2 nights (all meals and drinks)****Giraffe Manor**

Giraffe Manor is set in 12 acres of private land within 140 acres of indigenous forest and is only 20 kilometres from Nairobi city centre. Built in the 1930s, this luxury boutique hotel has maintained all the charm of the era and is now famous for its resident herd of Rothschild Giraffe. Giraffe Manor offers you an unparalleled experience of the giraffes, with them vying for your attention at the breakfast table, the front door and even your bedroom window. Inspired by the manor's original 1930's decor, the 6 double bedrooms have been designed with large 4 poster beds, antique furnishing, striking art decor and spacious bathrooms.

Nairobi

Kenya's capital city has risen from a highland swampland called by the Ewaso Nai'beri – the place of cold – by the local Masai. When railway workers reached this area in 1899, they set up a basic camp and supply depot. The camp became a rustic village, and then a shanty town, which by 1907 was the capital of all of British East Africa. It was soon an important centre for the colony and a mecca for adventurers, hunters and travellers from all over the world. Modern Nairobi is still the safari capital of the Africa, and has become one of Africa's largest and most interesting cities.

**Day 22****01 Aug 2014****Nairobi**

You will have the day in which to relax or to arrange other excursions in the area.

Day 23**02 Aug 2014****Nairobi ~ Stone Town**

After an early breakfast you will be transferred to the Jomo Kenyatta International Airport for your flight **KQ6710** departing at **08h10** to Zanzibar Island. Upon arrival at the Zanzibar International Airport at **09h50** you will be met and transferred into Stone Town where you will spend **1 night** at the **Swahili House** on a **bed and breakfast basis**. You will have the remainder of the day to explore the historic area, visiting the markets and enjoying some of the local cuisine.



Arrive: 02 Aug 2014 | Depart: 03 Aug 2014

1 night (breakfast)



Swahili House

Swahili House, located in the heart of Stone Town, was originally built in the 19th century. It has been restored to its original state, but with certain changes, combining traditional influences with modern day facilities. There are 5 floors which are built around a beautiful traditional Zanzibar courtyard. The 22 rooms spread out over 4 floors and are divided into 3 different room categories. All rooms are decorated in traditional Swahili style

Stone Town

The capital of Zanzibar is Zanzibar Town, in which Stone Town is a bustling, energetic and fascinating ancient part. With narrow mazes as streets, and intricately carved doors decorating the white-washed buildings, Stone Town invites you to explore its inner zones, and many an hour can be spent taking it all in. The sights and sounds, and the spicy smells, somehow remind you of a time long ago, and on exiting the web of alleys you feel as if you have left behind another world in another age.



Day 24	03 Aug 2014	Zanzibar
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After a morning exploring Stone Town and lunch on your own arrangements, you will be met at the **Swahili House** and transferred to the **Matemwe Lodge and Bungalows** where you will spend **3 nights** on a **full board basis**.

Arrive: 03 Aug 2014 | Depart: 06 Aug 2014

3 nights (all meals)



Matemwe Beach Lodge

Matemwe lies perched on a coral rock, surrounded by pristine beaches and right opposite the Mnemba Atoll, which offers spectacular diving and snorkelling. Set in a lush garden, the lodge consists of 12 beautiful bungalows all built from local materials. Each suite has a private veranda, with a hammock and couch from which you have a glorious view of the Indian Ocean. The bathroom is large with a deep bathtub and walk-in shower. Although mosquitoes are rare in Matemwe, all rooms are equipped with a large mosquito net. The open-air restaurant overlooks the ocean and has a tranquil lounge area. Seafood is the specialty of the house, with all produce bought daily from the local markets. Lunch is a buffet offering a delicious mix of African and European flavours.



Zanzibar

The Zanzibar Archipelago has lured travellers to its pristine, white beaches for centuries. The main island of Zanzibar (correctly named Unguja), has a plethora of accommodation options, ranging from rustic beach bungalows to large and glitzy resorts, and can offer something to everyone's taste. Sandy beaches run the length of the coast, shaded by green palm trees, and caressed by turquoise waters.

**Day 25 & 26****04 & 05 Aug 2014****Zanzibar**
